





MEDICINE, NAZISM AND THE HOLOCAUST MOOC- PILOT



BACKGROUND

After three years of a successful launch of a Hebrew version of a Medicine, Nazism, and the Holocaust MOOC (Massive Open Online Course), with close to 2000 learners and outstanding feedback, we have produced an English-version of this MOOC. We have approached international leading scholars who generously gave time and expertise, traveled to North America and Europe for this purpose, and have applied rigorous course design to combine the lectures with additional resources, assignments, a discussion forum, and reflection opportunities. We are now ready to pilot this course.

DESCRIPTION

The course is comprised of 9 units that are offered every two weeks, thus spanning 5 months of active study. It is free of charge and all assignments, reflections, and forum discussions will be provided with the course directors' feedback. In addition, we will welcome comments and feedback on the MOOC by the learners to debug and further improve the MOOC before widespread dissemination.

We have also integrated recommendations and content of the Lancet Commission on medicine, Nazism and the Holocaust published Nov 2023.

The pilot is limited to 50 participants. Admission will be on a first come, first admitted basis. Groups (faculty and/or learners) are welcome, and if exceeding the capacity may be accommodated into specific "classes".
